

- (1) Majority comes from perennial plants which were planted before shmittah. Those are not sefichin.
- (2) The tree bears fruit only after more than a year from its planting.
- (3) These can be stored for extended periods. Thus, produce picked before Rosh Hashanah of the shmittah year can be on the market during the following year. This can cause problems during the post-shmittah year, beyond the cutoff date listed here.
- (4) Some of the winter produce comes from the southern Aravah which is outside of Eretz Yisroel.
- (5) Some garlic is planted and sprouts before Rosh HaShanah. It can be stored passed the dates listed here. Some produce is imported. It is easy to recognize the difference between old and new produce. The final sefichin date given here is for dry garlic. The final sefichin date for fresh garlic [with green leaves] is at the end of the winter 5783.
- (6) Grown only by non Jews.
- (7) This pertains to the fresh produce (paprika and hot peppers). However, paprika is marketed mainly in powder form. Forbidden paprika powder (sefichin) is marketed from the end of the shmittah year until a year later, while kedushas shevi'is begins already in Cheshvan of the shmittah year. The overwhelming majority of ground hot peppers is from imports.
- (8) Around this time, shmittah produce is still available. During the transition period, one must distinguish between the old and new produce.
- (9) While the majority of the produce is picked before Rosh Hashonah, some is picked after Rosh Hashonah, hence some of the produce available during the shmittah year has k'dushas shevi'is. The second set of dates refers to those planted later.
- (10) Early watermelons come from the Aravah region. Some of these may come from the southern Aravah which is outside of the boundaries of Eretz Yisroel.
- (11) Watermelons from other regions begin appearing from Iyar and on. Some of these come from fields of non Jews.
- (12) Old produce can be stored beyond this date, and is forbidden because of sefichin.

- (1) Almonds and all types of nuts can remain edible for long periods of time. Thus possible that they are marketed beyond the dates appearing here.
- (2) It is impossible to pinpoint the exact day when the new produce arrives. However, it might be possible to distinguish between old and new produce.
- (3) The early species cannot be refrigerated for extended periods.
- (4) Some fruits undergo some of the following processes: refrigeration, canning, drying, pickling, squeezing to juice, crushing into sauce, processing with sugar, etc.. This enables such fruits to be marketed long after the picking season has expired. If fruits are marketed after the biur date, they may not be eaten.
- (5) Avocado- it is possible that there are still Reed-variety avocados (round) in the stores at the beginning of the season, which are sixth-year fruits. Likewise the seventh year fruits can be marketed after the cutoff date.
- (6) The early ones may have blossomed before Rosh HaShanah, and require T'rumos and Ma'as'ros.
- (7) Old produce can be refrigerated for extended periods of time, and appear in the markets together with fresh produce form the following year. It might be possible to visually distinguish between the produce of different years.
- (8) Green lemons sold from Nissan onwards should be treated with k'dushas shvi'is.
- (9) The majority are imports. The dates here apply to local produce.
